Confirming Experiences



There is a breath of spring in the air as I write. Whether this will last without an early interruption of summer heat, I won't guess. But entering into the wonderful experiences of Easter, Spring,

Confirmation and Pentecost, it is a month full of the resurrected Christ and the blowing of the Spirit – a festival of color and new life.

The temptation is to ascribe these forces to ourselves, to our achievements and to the special qualities and depth of knowledge in the many moving parts of Saint Michael. All this vitality and rebirth are directly attached to God's actions of love, both in Jesus' self-offering and resurrection on Easter and the gift of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. There's a Match for Danielle Bone Marrow Transplant Scheduled

A bone marrow match has been found for Danielle Stephens, the Saint Michael parishioner suffering from Leukemia. The transplant is scheduled for May 21st at M.D. Anderson Hospital in Houston.

A bone marrow volunteer registration drive seeking a potential donor for Danielle was held at Saint Michael on April 7th and again on April 12th. More than 2,600 people participated, which is the largest drive ever held in the Dallas area. While the donor, most likely, comes from outside the area, the Dallas drive has made infinitely more life-giving bone marrow matches possible around the country.

In announcing that the match had been discovered, Danielle's husband, Chad, wrote: "We want to thank ALL OF YOU so much for all you have done! It is so hard to believe that

Construction Updates



Columbarium Construction Starts

Construction of the new Columbarium and Courtyard Nave is underway with completion expected late this summer.

A screened safety fence was erected around the site which created a staging area for the construction materials. The south entrance to the church (near the Brides Room) will be closed during the construction period.

The handicap and senior parking was relocated to the north parking lot to a well marked area near the northeast entrance to the church, near the choir room. Handicap parking is designated along the north wall of the building with easy access to either the North Lanai or the entrance near the choir room.

The South Lanai porte cochere driveway is not impacted by the construction, but it is important that it be used only for delivery or pick-ups. Parishioners are asked not to park in the drive.

O.M. Roberts Elementary School in Jubilee Park Nears Completion

More volunteer opportunities with the opening this fall

The new O.M. Roberts Elementary School, serving the Jubilee Park neighborhood, will be completed this summer and will open for the 2013-2014 school year in the fall. It replaces the original school facility which was built in 1909.



"Our residents are so excited to see the progress that has been made on the new school," said Ben Leal, executive director of Jubilee Park. "We are looking forward to continuing our partnership with DISD to make O.M. Roberts the best school in Dallas."

It is anticipated that the O.M. Roberts will open with about 660 students and could grow to serve about 800 children. The opening of the new school will present many more volunteer opportunities. For several years parishioners from Saint Michael and All Angels have volunteered at O.M. Roberts tutoring children in reading, math, and helping with school events and activities.



Previously one of the lowest performing schools in the Dallas Independent School District, O.M. Roberts has achieved an Exemplary status within the district. Much of the success has been attributed to community volunteer activities generated through the Jubilee Park Community Center. "With the expanded student body and facilities, more volunteers will be needed in the next school year," Leal stated. If you would like to be a part of the new O.M. The Saint Michael Foundation Grants Funds for Children's Programs

Children's programs were the focus of the Saint Michael Foundation's actions at its meeting in April. Funds were appropriated to help with construction of a new playscape and playground, and will provide money to train three volunteers for the Children and Family Ministry's Catechesis of the Good Shepherd program.

The new playground will be constructed on the vacant land at northeast corner of the church's campus. The Foundation's grant of \$50,000 will supplement funds raised by parents at the annual "Chairish Party" and from other foundations. The new facility which is expected to be completed by early June will enhance programs of the Saint Michael Preschool and will be available for use on Sundays, at parish events, and at the Farmers Market. It will also be available to the public when not being used for scheduled church or school activities.



The Saint Michael Foundation also granted \$1,800 to train three new volunteer teachers for Catechesis of the Good Shepherd, a program of religious formation for young people based on the Montessori education principals. Currently Saint Michael has Level 1 (ages 3 -6) and Level 2 (ages 6-9) programs with 60 children participating on Sunday mornings and 35 at the preschool. There is a need to expand Catechesis of the Good Shepherd, which requires more trained teachers. The training will begin in August.



Saint Michael Children's Program Featured in *Episcopal Teacher*

An article on Saint Michael's "Lego" My Bible" children's program, developed by Emily Given, Director of Children and Family Ministries, is featured in the Spring edition of *Episcopal Teacher*, a magazine published by the Center for the Ministry of Teaching at Virginia Theological Seminary.




The program grew out of what Ms. Given called the "vast, uncharted territory called 'Boy Faith'...the rough and ragged place where boys live, learn and grow...I needed to figure out a new language for faith expression," she said. Arts and crafts just didn't work, she concluded. "I finally found the place where real life meets faith

sharing: Legos®. Lots of them."

The result: Lego My Bible, a six week after-school group for Kindergarten through Grade 4. It was open to both boys and girls, but the turnout was heavily male. They turned Bible stories to reality with Legos. "I have watched as the Lego walls of Jericho were built and then came crashing down," Ms. Given said. "There is no shortage of material to be explored, created, and discovered."

She relates a story about one five year old who, she said, was struggling with building anything related to the story. One day she watched as the youngster was digging deep into his bucket of Legos, clearly on a mission. His final product was a tiny creation consisting of three logo pieces. "It is Jonah," he said. "The fish wasn't angry.



He was a helper. This is Jonah and the whale," he proudly displayed. "He was waiting...waiting for God. Sometimes you need to wait for God, Ms. Emily."

That's when she knew it worked. "I was standing in the presence of a pint-sized prophet," she said.

The next edition of "Lego My Bible" will be included in the Children and Family Ministries fall line-up.



Pastoral Care:

Remembering Our Loved Ones

Losing a loved one is always difficult. Those first weeks after a death are so shocking, yet we are typically surrounded by people to support us. As time moves on, the shock wears off and sometimes the support lessens. Our lives begin to find a new rhythm and as each new day comes, healing takes place. Even though healing is taking place, there will always be a place in our hearts where we remember those we've lost and see no longer.

Here at Saint Michael and All Angels we have a number of opportunities to remember those who have died. Annually, on All Saints' Day, we read the necrology, the list of all who have died since the previous All Saints' Day. During Advent we host our Liturgy of Remembrance and Light to comfort those dealing with loss. Monthly we offer Faith & Grief Luncheons to support people on their journey of grief and provide a safe place where sharing stories leads to healing. And weekly, we read aloud the names of the departed in the Prayers for the People. Even with these ministry touch points in place there is always more that can be done to remember our loved ones.

We have begun a monthly service of remembrance at our Wednesday Healing Service. On the second Wednesday of every month, the Eucharist will be said in honor of those that died that month a year ago. Through the work of the Pastoral Care office and our Associate, The Rev. Lisa Flores, notes inviting families to join in remembering their loved one are sent out each month.
