Epiphany is About Getting Specific, Being Located

The Christian faith is fond of saying that God is everywhere, and while that's true, God is revealed and manifested "somewhere." While God is



universal in presence, care, and love, we know God and make God known in the specific, located, and incarnate aspects of daily living. The Christian faith is precisely about mixing heaven and earth, the

sacred and the profane, the transcendent and the imminent. "The Word became flesh," is the enduring message of Christmas in John's Gospel. Or as Archbishop William Temple put it in his classic book *Nature, Man and God*, "Christianity is the world's most materialistic religion."

Against that hard truth, we are surrounded today by loose thinking and comfortable euphemisms. People say things like, "I'm spiritual but not religious," or "I believe in God, but I'm not interested in the Church." Or as a good friend in another church used to say to me, "Bob, I don't really need corporate liturgy, I like the outdoors on Sunday mornings ... And besides, I follow the Sermon on the Mount." I didn't ever ask him if he really knew the famous Sermon of Jesus, but I sincerely doubted he was following Jesus' difficult commands on the golf course; but then I haven't known anyone who has come very close to following Jesus' dictums -- at least not consistently over a lifetime.

Christian spirituality is wide and diverse, but we drain it of meaning if we think our spirituality is not rooted in the flesh; highly material, specific,

Bishop of Kansas, The Rt. Rev. Dean Wolfe, former Vice Rector Visits Saint Michael

The Rt. Rev. Dean Wolfe, Bishop of Kansas will pay a return visit to Saint Michael and All Angels on Sunday, January 12. He will preach, participate in Baptism, and celebrate mass at the 9:00 worship service. At 11:00, Bishop Wolfe will preach, confirm new adult members, and celebrate Holy Communion.

Dr. Wolfe served as Vice Rector of Saint Michael and All Angels for 5 years prior to his election as Bishop in July of 2003. He became the ninth Bishop of Kansas in January of 2004, overseeing 46 congregations, two campus ministry centers, and one secondary school. Currently Bishop



Wolfe serves as the Vice President of the House of Bishops, Chair of the House of Bishops Planning Committee, delegate to the World Council of Churches, and member of the Presiding Bishop's Council of Advice.

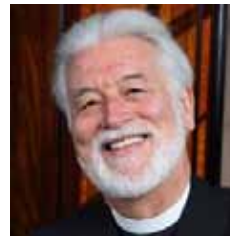

Distinguished Lecture Series



March 2 The Very Reverend Alan Jones, Dean-Emeritus, Grace Cathedral, San Francisco



Dr. Jones was the Dean of Grace Cathedral in San Francisco from 1985 until January 2009. Previously, he served as the Stephen F. Bayne Professor of Ascetical Theology at the General Theological Seminary in New

York City from 1972 to 1982 where he founded the Center for Christian Spirituality. He is a prominent lecturer both nationally and internationally and has written several books, articles, and editorial opinions.

April 6 The Reverend Becca Stevens, Chaplin at Vanderbilt University and founder of Magdalene and Thistle Farms.



Becca Stevens is a premiere preacher and speaker who proclaims love as the most powerful force for social change. She is an Episcopal priest and founder of Magdalene, residential communities of women who have survived prostitution, trafficking

and addiction. In 2001, she founded Thistle Farms which employs nearly 50 residents and graduates, and houses a natural body care line, a paper and sewing studio and the Thistle Stop Café. In 2011 she was named by the White House as one of 15 Champions of Change for violence against women.

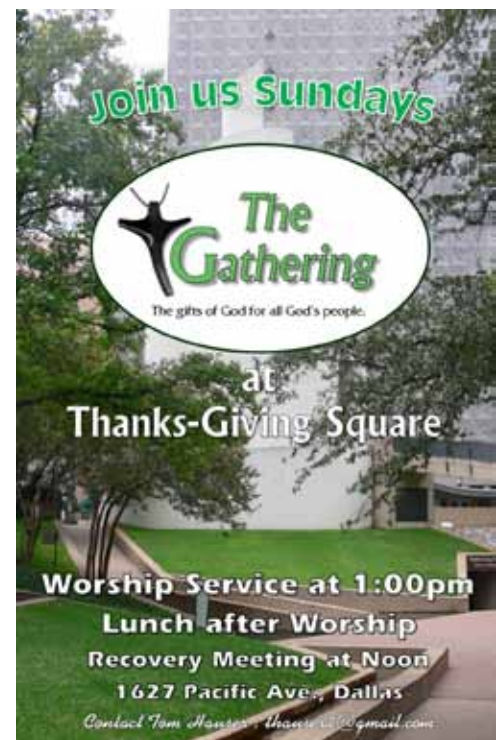


Saint Michael Serves at The Gathering.

Care for The Caregivers

The Caregiver Support Group Mission is to make resources available for all members of the parish who are in the role of care giving.

To address this goal, we invite you to attend our support group meetings that are held in the Church Parlor on the first and third Mondays of each month. We gather at 11:00, meet others who are care givers and share general information about Care giving and more explicit information regarding Alzheimer patient care and Care Giving Resources. Our support group is a safe Christian environment in which to talk confidentiality regarding the needs, concerns, problems and opportunities that care givers face. We are finished by 12:30.



We know that everyone can't attend our meetings due to the everyday demands of jobs outside the home, or the constant care of their loved one. We would like to reach out to those of you who can't come to the meetings and offer you our support.

One way for us to help you is through a new project that is being launched this year. It is the Care Giver's Corner in the church's Power Library. You will be able to check out books on specific subjects, and large-piece, age-appropriate puzzles that aid in working with dementia patients. Additionally, Care givers will find brochures listing services available in the community with contact numbers and addresses. Also, materials will list resources for various other care giver needs. We will update the list of available books and materials as we build our library.

Another way we support this ministry is through guest speakers who are experts. The ice storm made it necessary to cancel his first date and we are pleased to announce that we were able to reschedule Paul Markowitz, founder of Senior Living Specialists, to speak on the 'Top 10 Things to Think About When Touring Senior Living Options'. 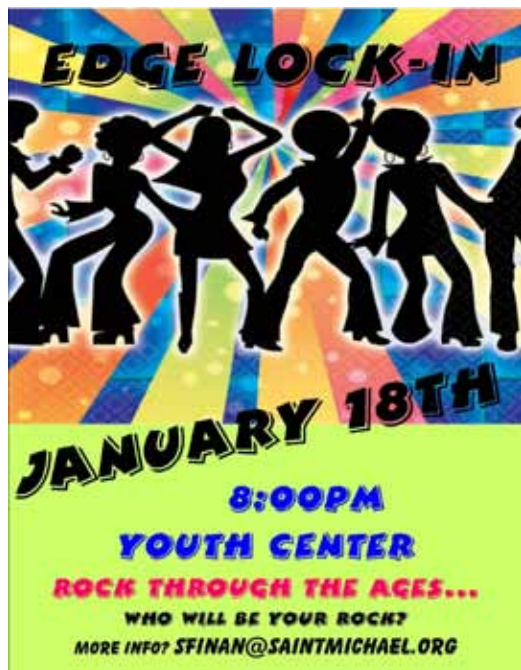

Epiphany is About Getting Specific, Being Located

and located. In a world like ours, everyone needs some solid grounding, a centering in the faith. And our tradition and our parish, as it happens, has just the opportunities for you, and for our time.

The time could very well be now. The Epiphany season is not just about a located, manifested faith, but also about the here and now, and not so much about the distant and the later. Hillel, the first-century Jewish sage and teacher, famously asked, "If I am for myself, then who will be for me? And if I am only for myself, then what am I? And if not now, when?"

During the coming month there are several significant ways that you can ground your faith, giving tangible expression to the words we say: The larger-than-life Magi on Epiphany Eve -- January 5 at 5:30 in the Church -- will bring to life our calling to be "in the world," manifesting Christ's light in the dark places. The very next Sunday (January 12), the liturgies of Baptism and Confirmation will be public affirmations of God's gifting and empowerment for ministry. The continuing annual stewardship effort -- which we need to conclude by the end of January -- recalls for us the tangible uses of money which stands for work and value and mission. While money can rob of us of our sleep and distort the beauty of human life, it can also enable good works, healing, and support. When we use the word "stewardship," we evoke the original mandate given all life at Creation. Give what you've been given; use your resources for building up faithful life. In addition to financial commitments, we also have new study groups, Sunday morning adult classes and Foyer Dinner Groups commencing in January. And during this month are preparations for many mission opportunities; trips to Honduras, Rose Bud, and Costa Rica. Please let us know if you have interest.

To live into our calling, to help Saint Michael and All Angels defy the marginalizing of sane religion in this time, we need to be specific and located. We ask you to make Saint Michael a high priority in your life, with your energy, your resources, your skills. In love, we ask you to consider specific involvement, to be a significant expression of the word becoming flesh.
