There is a tremendous sense of giftedness and joy in the New Testament accounts of Jesus' resurrection and the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. "You crucified this Jesus," said the Apostle Peter in the very first Christian sermon, "and killed him by the hands of lawless people. But God raised him up, having loosed the pangs of death because it was not possible for him to be held by it." (Acts 2:23f.)

What the Bible claims about Jesus on Easter is not mere resuscitation nor just a symbolic, spring-like, seasonal rebirth; not some temporary extra span of life which will end sometime in the future. No, on Easter, real life beat real death and Christ poured out the first gift to the huddled disciples: the Holy Spirit, the same Spirit (breath) of God that was present in Creation.

The temptation is to ascribe our resources, joy and growth to ourselves, to our achievements and to the special qualities of our church community. The Spirit is of God, not of ourselves. Both the otherness and inwardness of The Spirit are for us to discover again and again. The Greek word which is translated spirit literally means fiery breath, breath mingled with fire, and it represented, in antiquity, the notion which science represents today by the word energy.

Saint Michael's has an abundance of energy. I invite you to participate in our congregation by treating your own energy and the parish's as the gifts from God that they are.

Thus, I mention several highlights for the coming month(s):

- Bishop James Stanton is coming on Sunday, May 6 to confirm at 11:00 (Adults) and 3:00 (6th graders);
- The Episcopal Church is holding a General Convention this summer. The Rector will have a pre-convention session for the parish on Sunday, May 20 at 10:00 in the Chapel;
- We are building an exciting addition to our Columbaria on the South lawn, including a new South Courtyard and illumination doors in the South wall of the Church (please see inside for further information);
- The Day of Pentecost and Baptism is on Sunday, May 27th.

Do you have a sense of purpose? Are your days filled with the joy of resurrected living? These are the questions of Easter. Come ask them and join us in the Easter journey.

A New Courtyard Columbarium

During the coming months we will be constructing a new Courtyard Columbarium with an attending Nave Courtyard with pivoting stained glass doors opening onto the lawn from the south wall of the church. In the midst of a landscaped courtyard will be an inspiring 860 niche columbarium. Designed by world-renown architect, Max Levy, it will include areas for “green interment,” pet burials, a Memorial Wall, and access illumination doors, bringing more natural light into our worship space.

Great Accomplishments of the Past 50 years: Good Shepherds of Saint Michael: Neighbors Helping Neighbors

A parishioner recently said about Saint Michael's Good Shepherds, "It's hard for me to express what it means to have such caring and loving people on this journey with me and my family, whether they are bringing us dinner, offering a hug, or checking on our needs; their caring presence is felt."

In 1984, Litty Turner and Sue Patton saw a need: there were a lot of parishioners who needed help whether during an illness, a loss of a loved one, the birth of a new baby, and the list went on. They formed a committee with a mandate, "Love one another" ... "Feed my sheep, tend my lambs, feed my sheep." Their mission was simple, neighbor helping neighbor. Getting it organized was the tough job.

Litty and Sue started with the church directory and plotted every household on a map, defining "neighborhoods" within the church. Initially there were 66 neighborhoods which were grouped into six regions, each with a Regional Shepherd who recruited their team of shepherds. It took the better part of two years to get the program developed and organized (computers weren't on every desk then).

In 1986, the Good Shepherd Ministry was commissioned. In the ensuing 27 years Good Shepherds have responded to the needs of fellow parishioners, celebrating their victories and accomplishments, and comforting and caring during times of struggle. Many of the Good Shepherd's activities have

spawned new ministries within Saint Michael, such as the Card Ministry, the Funeral Guild, the Welcome Ministry, and the Extended Care Cooks.

Addressing more than 100 Shepherds at the group's Annual Meeting last year, co-founder Litty Turner said, "Often we wonder what can I do to make a difference? What is a worthwhile way for me to spend my time? What is God's will for me? Then we look in the scripture and see His command that we love one another and bear one another's burdens. The Good Shepherd Ministry at Saint Michael and All Angels is a specific structure in place to help do these things."

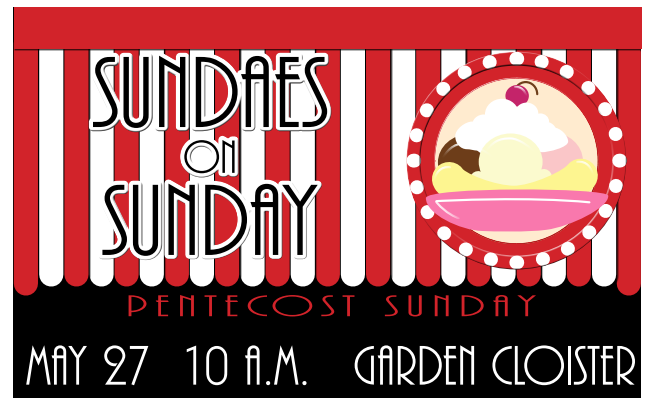
P.T. Cruisers

Women of Saint Michael Spring Luncheon

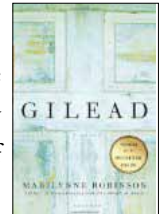
